### About this policy

# Scope of the policy

• This policy deals with the use of all forms of social media

### Principles

- Ely RSC will not tolerate the following on any social media platform
  - Negative comments about the club or anyone associated with the club and GBSA
  - Any posts that bring the clubs reputation into question
  - Harassment or bullying of any members and anyone associated with the club
- Ely RSC asks that as a general principle coaches, members and parents/carers do not post offensive or discriminatory comments and that posts involving any athletes are respectful.

# Fundraising

As a club we have a lot of opportunities to fundraise for things like training days, club kit, coaches' expenses etc, however there are standard we ask members, parent/quardians to comply with the following:

- We encourage that all members and their parents/carers get involved in fundraising
- All members and the committee will be open and honest regarding what the fundraising will support and how funds will be distributed
- Fundraising money will be managed by the Treasurer or elected individuals

#### For International fundraising:

- All fundraising completed under the name of Ely RSC will be shared equally between all international events in a skating year and capped at the amount agreed by the committee
- There is a maximum amount of fundraised monies available to individuals who are selected to skate internationally. Once this amount is reached the remaining monies will go back into the club
